# THE POLISH STATE ADRIFT

After the Constitutional Court banned abortions in cases of foetal abnormalities in October 2020, Polish people started massive strikes in the country. On Wednesday, February 27th, however, the ruling became a law, leading to new demonstrations. Moreover, the Polish State has often been threatening the independence of courts and judges since 2016. Recently, it allowed the Disciplinary Chamber of the Supreme Court -for which independence and impartiality are not guaranteed- to make decisions that directly impact judges and the execution of their duties.


